Blogging - are you doing it? Are your kids? Do you know what they're blogging about?
Do you know what blogging is?

Blogging is a web based log or journal that includes a person's thoughts and ideas in reverse chronological order. Blogs can include web links to other people's blogs or favorite web sites and may also include photos, audio and even video. Most Blog sites allow others to post comments on the entries, which can allow discussions to occur on them. These are being used as a social network of friends, communities of learners, and for people who have common interests. Blogging, unless kept private, is considered a form of social media.

When students' blog and use social media, are they making good choices in what they're including in their posts and journals? Social Media has many merits when used appropriately. It provides a way for socializing, communicating, validating and sharing ones ideas. But unfortunately, there is a dark side to blogging and posting online. Are students connecting with like minds? Are they giving out too much information? Are they using their own creations, or recklessly stealing other's intellectual property? Are they leaving a positive digital footprint, or inadvertently damaging reputations. There are several areas that should be of concern when using online communities, blogs and other social media sites; ID theft, fraud, privacy abuses, cyberbullying, cyberstalking, harassment, plagiarism, predators and exploitations are just a few. Some online communities and social media are more protected than others and many have age restrictions.

Here at Frederick School, students are being instructed in "Digital Citizenship" using a variety of internet safety curriculum resources. We are encouraging students to build a positive digital footprint.
